# Student Aid helps keep teaching dream on track

Alisa Briscoe was a typical college student in her last two quarters at Western Washington University, working toward her dream of becoming a teacher. Everything was on track: her waitress job paid enough to take care of school expenses, gas, tolls; she had it covered, and just couldn't wait to begin her professional life.

Then along came the worldwide pandemic, and her dream hit a full stop.

The restaurant closed, and suddenly Alisa was out of work. She could no longer afford those books and transportation costs, but she wasn't ready to give up.

Her search for online resources pointed her to the Gig Harbor Peninsula FISH Food Bank and Community Services website. She scheduled a phone interview with the education aid counselor.

"I was nervous the first time I called," Alisa said. "But I was met

with the most kind, caring and knowledgeable volunteers. They showed me they would go above and beyond to keep me in school by providing textbooks, school supplies, and even refilling my gas tank during my student teaching."

Alisa graduated with a degree in Elementary Education and is working in what she calls her "field of dreams" as a teacher.

Alisa was proud to be featured on GHP FISH's Virtual Hard Hat Tour in early April. She wants to make sure other students who encounter difficult situations to know that their educations don't
